

## **WWO High School Dual Credit Pathway**


#### YFAR | Introduction to Water and Wastewater Operations

(emphasis on applied science, math and blueprint reading, use of pumps and piping systems, safety practices and risk management)



#### YFAR II Water Treatment and Distribution Processes

(emphasis on water and wastewater treatment, operational principles of water distribution systems and equipment, inspection and maintenance)



#### YEAR III


Optional Industry Specialization in an area of student/employer preference and choice:

- · specialization in water treatment and providing NAIT Water Treatment Certificate, OR
- · specialization in wastewater treatment and providing NAIT Wastewater Treatment Certificate, OR
- specialization in water distribution and collection and leading to NAIT Water Distribution and Collection Certificate.

Note: To complete requirements of the Water Distribution and Collection certificate, students will require a 4th year of high school study or enroll in additional courses directly with NAIT following high school graduation.

## Water and Wastewater Operations


#### **Level I Certification**

- Requirements for provincial Level I operator certification:
  - completion of Level I training requirements
  - a high school diploma or GED
  - one year of acceptable operating experience
  - successfully writing the provincial Level I certification exam
- Transition to Level II, III and IV certification possible upon meeting the requisite training, experience and exam requirements.



- Practical: 10-15 Wk Exp Credits





# **Learning Schedules**

## **Student Selection Criteria**

- Average to superior academic standing
- Successful completion or concurrent enrolment in:
  - Math 10C
  - Science 10
  - ELA 10-1 or 10-2
- Attitude/behaviour, attendance, punctuality, time management, work habits
- Recommendations from the school
- Industry screening and selection.





# **NAIT** Tuition

- NAIT tuition of \$950 for each of Year I and Year II will be paid by the student's school or school system
- ➤ A one-time "caution" fee of \$300 per student will be levied by the school, refundable upon successful program completion

- Student discuss interest/suitability with school's Program Coordinator
- 2. Complete the CAREERS Program Application
- Student applications screened by the school and CAREERS
- 4. Participate in a successful interview with CAREERS and the Industry Sponsor
- 5. Upon acceptance, complete a post-secondary registration package
